3-6 mile rides

Sun 8 Oct @ 10am - 11.30am

Four Parks (5 mile option) Traffic free ride through Sefton & Otterspool Parks and Festival Gardens.

Wed 18 Oct @ 10am - 12.30pm

History Ride: Garstang Museum (6 miles) Cycle through Sefton & Princes Park and past the cathedrals to the university campus. Spend an hour at the Garstang Museum of Archaeology before cycling back.

Sun 29 Oct @ 10am – 11.30am

Sefton Park Explorer All Age Ride (3 miles) Traffic free ride in Sefton Park. Accompanied children who can cycle 3 miles welcome.

9-11 mile rides

Sun 8 Oct @ 10am - 12.30pm

Four Parks (11 mile option) Explore Sefton,
Otterspool and Princes Parks plus Festival Gardens &
the Prom.

Fri 13 Oct @ 12pm - 2.30pm

Pier Head & the Prom (9 miles) Cycle along quiet roads to Liverpool One and the Pier Head. Return via the Prom and Festival Gardens.



20+ mile rides

Sat 14 Oct @ 9.30am - 3.30pm

Ferry Tavern (23 or 34 miles) Follow the Loop Line to Halewood and cycle to Pickerings Pasture, & along the Mersey & St Helen's canal to the Ferry Tavern. Return via Hale, Speke and Garston.

Sun 15 Oct @ 9.30am - 3.30pm

Lancashire Lanes (35 miles) Cycle along the Loop Line to Aintree then on country lanes to Melling, Halsall and Ormskirk. Catch the train back to Liverpool.

Sat 21 Oct @ 9.30am - 4.30pm

Tour de Wirral (28 or 42 miles) From Hamilton Sq cycle to Burton and Neston. Follow the Wirral Way to West Kirby and catch train home for 28 mile ride or cycle back to Hamilton Sq for 42 mile ride.

Sun 29 Oct @ 9.30am - 3.30pm

Norton Priory (32 miles) Norton Priory & back via Hale village, Runcorn Silver Jubilee Bridge & the Bridgewater canal.
